It is with great sadness that we mark the passing of longtime AAOS volunteer Harry Clark Winter, who died peacefully on January 23, 2022 at the age of 80.

Harry was born in New Britain, CT in 1941. He received his B.S. degree in agricultural and biologic chemistry from Penn State 1962 and his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Wisconsin. He ultimately joined the University of Michigan faculty in 1975, where among other things he made major contributions to the field of glycobiology. Harry retired in 2008 as a research assistant professor emeritus of biological chemistry.

Harry and Dottie were high school friends, and married in 1977. In 1992, they attended the Michigan Orchid Society show at Laurel Park. There, they picked up one of Neal and Meredith Foster's fliers about starting an Ann Arbor orchid society, and attended the organizational meetings.

As we all know, over the next 25+ years they became indispensable volunteers for AAOS, taking care of everything from making the coffee before meetings, to organizing registration of orchids for shows.

Dottie shared that Harry loved all sorts of orchids, and would often bring home something different that had caught his interest.

Harry will be greatly missed. In his honor, the AAOS will have a Harry Winter memorial trophy for our 2022 Festival.

About Dr. Kristen Uthus:

Dr. Kristen Uthus studied both plant and animal ecology and evolution at Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) and the Ohio State University (OSU). She then taught biology and ecology at several colleges including VCU, OSU, University of Michigan, and Eastern Michigan University.

The daughter of a plant fanatic, Kristen has been growing orchids for over 20 years, and in 2014 she fulfilled her dream of making orchids a full-time commitment by purchasing NWO.

Although she enjoys growing many varieties of orchids and other plants, miniatures remain her passion—the weirder the better. New World Orchids specializes in Japanese species including Neofinetia falcata, Dendrobium moniliforme, and Sederia japonica, but her miniature selection includes many other small species including Pleurothallids, Bulbophyllums, and Angraecums.

AAOS ORCHID SHOW DISPLAY GUIDELINES

Since the pandemic has put us out of practice with showing our beautiful plants, below is a good reminder of what is needed from each member when giving a plant for our displays at shows.

A note from Deb:

Because it is impossible to create a quality display with registered plants in a matter of minutes, the following procedures have been formulated.

All lists of plants to be entered in the Show must be emailed to: debschatzle@gmail.com by noon on the Wednesday prior to the show. No late plant lists will be accepted. Deb will forward the verified names to Paige, who will then prepare the labels to be used in the Show.

This needs to be done to allow time to look up each and every plant, find the correct current name, determine the appropriate class the plant will be entered, create a registration tag for the plant (so it can be judged), and print a label for each plant for the Show display. Our labels are hand-printed by Paige. All of this takes time.

Plants for each show must arrive at the show site no later than noon on Friday for set-up. This schedule applies to our own show, as well. No late plants can be added into the Show display. It is imperative to have plants on-site timely for set-up (staking with registration tags, bagging, labeling), so the display design can be determined/executed at a reasonable hour.

We can do better than, "shows by the seat of our pants." Let's!
