

About Edgar:

My interest in orchids began when I was just six or seven years old. I found a plant growing in the roadside ditch near our house in North East Ohio. When my father got home from work, I dragged him over to see my discovery. He said "Oh! That's an orchid." My first orchid find was a Spiranthes (probably cernua).

A few years later my family drove to Alaska and back. On that trip, I found a Calypso bulbosa in Wyoming and several other orchids in Alaska and Canada. While in high school, I began growing some tropical orchids, and soon had a small collection. While in my final year at Case Western Reserve University my orchid collection moved to Florida with my parents. Sadly, I never saw them again (the orchids that is!). Also in my last year, I met Kim Sante who was working at the Cleveland Garden Center, now known as the Cleveland Botanical Garden.

Eventually Kim and I were married in Kenya Africa. Shortly after we were married we built a sun room on the corner of our house. This of course allowed my orchid collection to get a little out of hand. Finally in 1999 we began selling our plants to area florists, then through the orchid shows. We called our new business - Windswept in Time Orchids. We now attend close to fifteen shows a year, where our plants and exhibits have won many awards

Food Coordinator	Friday dinner through Sunday lunch	Ensures there is sufficient food and drink for show workers, vendors, judges, and clerks.
Kitchen Volunteers	2 hour shifts	Ensure the food and drink are set up and cleaned up as needed for their shift

Elections for the AAOS Board of Directors will be during our regular meeting in May.

We are particularly in need of people who are reliable and low drama to fill the Secretary position (1-year term, renewable for 3 years) and one of the Director positions (2-year term, renewable for 4 years.)

If you are interested in serving on the Board, please let a current Board member know.

The Board conducts routine business of the Society. The voting members of the Board consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Past President and two Directors.

Chairpersons of committees are appointed (rather than elected) and are nonvoting members of the Board.

A brief description of the responsibilities of each Board member is listed below:

- President: Sets the schedule and agenda for Board meetings, runs the general meetings.
- Vice President: Fills in for the President when the President isn't available.
- <u>Secretary</u>: Takes minutes of Board meetings. Conducts an election of a temporary meeting chairperson if both the President and Vice President aren't available.
- <u>Treasurer</u>: Handles the finances of the Society. Files all the taxes and other required documents with the State of Michigan and with the IRS.
- <u>Past President & Directors</u>: Assist the other members of the Board with decisionmaking and conducting the routine business of the Society.
