REMINDER OF IN PERSON MEETING PROTOCOLS FOR COVID

About Jim:

Jim France began collecting orchids in 1993, when after viewing a customer's collection, finally bought a cymbidium. As he tells many a beginner, everyone kills at least one ... and so it was promptly drowned. As it happened an orchid show was the following week, and the passion began.

He began by being part of an Orchid Society and learned from the experts in the group and from many of the wonderful growers that became friends. Fueled by his interest, Jim began selling in 1996, and established Oakwood Orchids. He dabbled in hybridization, and enjoyed the things that were more different than the normal orchids found easily.

Jim has grown under lights for 23 + years, and finally with the collection and business growing, two medium greenhouses are part of the business. Jim is past treasurer & president of the Miami Valley Orchid Society; past board member of MAOC shows, and is part of the AOS Orchid Judging program.

About Jim (continued):

The first orchid awarded was Catestum Hilltop's Dingbat 'Junior', a catasetum, named after his grandson. One of his favorites, catesetums, are a part of his collections and received 2 additional awards ... Catesetum piletum 'Leeann', and Catesetum osculatum 'The Boys'.

Enjoying a variety of orchids, another early award was for Phragmipedium Sergeant Eric "Hans', and spurred another part of the collection.

He has received a total of 23 AOS awards, including the 2019 annual American Orchid Society Roy T. Fukumura Vandaceous Award for Robiquetia cerina 'Donna's Treasures' AM/AOS



ORCHIDS AVAILABLE FROM CHERI GRISSOM

My orchid collection has outgrown my small house, and I'm downsizing. I have the following orchids I would like to rehome. All are what I would consider compact size at this time, in 3- or 4-inch pots. All are healthy and pest-free to the best of my knowledge:

- (1) Phal. Samera (bellina x violacia), from Gold Coast Orchids. Blooms reliably in the summer.
- (2) Phal. (bellina 'Jungle x sib' x bellina var. corulea), from Roberts Flower Supply. Blooms reliably in the summer.
- (3) Phal. Formosa Dream (amabilis x lobii), from Hausermann's. Blooms reliably, currently in flower/bud.
- (4) Phal. Liu's Fantasy, from Gold Country Orchids. Blooms reliably, currently flowering.

- (5) Phal. NoID, from Lowe's. For an idea of what it looks like, look up Phal. Sogo Vivien.
- (6) Phal. Jiaho's Pink Girl. From Hausermann's.
- (7) Phal. zebrina. Blooms reliably in the summer, usually only a few flowers.

I don't have a greenhouse or even a separate plant room. All of these plants would probably do even better if they had warmer temps, higher humidity, and perhaps better light, but I'm unable to provide that in my home.

All are free to a good home! If I still have any of them by our next meeting, I will bring them for the raffle table.

You're free to come to my home to have a look (I will bring them out to my garage briefly -- I'm still observing strict Covid precautions), or I'd be willing to meet you partway if we don't live reasonably close.
