About Russ:

Russ grew up in Cleveland, Ohio. Early on he had an interest in plants, helping in the yard and growing cacti purchased with his allowance. His parents and grandparents were all interested in various aspects of horticulture.

When Russ was 12 years old, his uncle arrived with 6 orchids saying," If you can grow those darned cacti, you ought to be able to grow these." And a career was launched.

Russ is a graduate of Ohio State University majoring in horticulture/floriculture. He has worked for Orchid by Hausermann, A&P Orchids, Ball State University's Wheeler Orchid Collection and Species Bank, and Jim Davis, the creator of Garfield the Cat.

In 2004, Russ and his wife Anita started New Vision Orchids. The company specializes in Phalaenopsis, Odontoglossums and their intergenerics, Miltoniopsis, Cattleyas, and Lycastes. The biggest area of focus is hybridizing, wholesale and retail sales. Russ also lectures to various orchid societies across the country and conducts workshops on orchid culture.

Russ is a judge of the American Orchid Society and is past President of the International Phalaenopsis Alliance, and Past President of the Mid-America Orchid Congress and serves on their Conservation Committee. He and Anita have two daughters.

Think you can't show your orchid in the AAOS display? Think again!

Are you still on the fence about loaning your orchid to the AAOS display for our festival? Here are some busted myths that may be holding you back!

MYTH #1: I can't show my orchid because it's a NOID or I lost the label for it.

BUSTED!: You can absolutely show orchids that are NOID! They are eligible for ribbons too!

MYTH #2: There's only one or two blooms on my orchid. It's not worth putting it in the display.

<u>BUSTED!</u>: Not true! Some orchids are not prolific bloomers. If you have even one beautiful bloom, it is more than welcome in the display!

MYTH #3: My orchid isn't good enough to win a ribbon or AOS award.

<u>BUSTED!</u>: Are you sure? Are you psychic? There's no way to know that ahead of time! Besides, the purpose of our displays is to showcase our love for growing orchids. The more diversity the better. Winning a ribbon or award is icing on the cake. Sharing the diversity of plants our group grows is always the number one priority.

Options for getting your plants to and from the show for display:

PLANT DROP OFF

- Bring your plants to the March 12 meeting and Shane or Vivian will take them to set up for Festival.
- Drop your plants off in the auditorium during set up on Friday March 17. You can bring them starting at 12 noon. Please bring them as early as possible so work on the display can begin sooner rather than later.

PLANT PICK UP

- Plant pick up begins on Sunday March 19 beginning between 4:30pm and 5pm.
- If you can't make pick up on the 19th, please make arrangements with a member who will be there to take it home for you.
- Any unclaimed plants by the end of tear down will go home with an AAOS member. That member will contact the grower to arrange reuniting grower and plant.

Please label your plant with your name and phone number on the outside of the pot.

- A spreadsheet is on Google Drive for you to enter the name of your plant you are loaning to the AAOS display. You can find it at this link: https://tinyurl.com/AAOS-display-plant-lists
 Enter as much information as you know about your plant. If you don't know the class, leave it blank. . .
- Names must be on the spreadsheet by Wednesday March 15 so show labels can be made.

Elections for the AAOS Board of Directors will be during our regular meeting in May.

The Board conducts routine business of the Society. The voting members of the Board consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Past President and two Directors.

Chairpersons of committees are appointed (rather than elected) and are nonvoting members of the Board.

A brief description of the responsibilities of each Board member are listed below:

- President: Sets the schedule and agenda for Board meetings, runs the general meetings.
- Vice President: Fills in for the President when the President isn't available.
- <u>Secretary</u>: Takes minutes of Board meetings. Conducts an election of a temporary meeting chairperson if both the President and Vice President aren't available.
- <u>Treasurer</u>: Handles the finances of the Society. Files all the taxes and other required documents with the State of Michigan and with the IRS.
- <u>Past President & Directors</u>: Assist the other members of the Board with decision making and conducting the routine business of the Society.
